The Bridge Church, St Ives (Warm Hub)	£400.00	£600/ month	We are paying approximately £600 per month for our combined gas and electricity (October 2022) and we anticipate that this will increase to double this amount in the coldest months. We are asking for the £400 to help to cover the costs we will incur for the period of time we are opening up and heating the building to operate as a warm hub. The church is funding all of the electricity and gas costs ourselves, we may experience our savings dropping below the recommended level (according to the charity commission) of 3 months operating costs in reserve. The £400 will be a big help towards retaining the correct reserves. However, we will operate as a warm hub regardless of the impact on the church reserves because we consider the warm hub is extremely important. Spotlight Productions	£1,000	£1,070	Back in 2004 we formed Huntingdon's first non-profit making musical youth theatre, Spotlight Productions and in the past 18 years over 1700 young people have performed in our shows. Our ethos is to encourage young people from any background to take part, which has resulted in the group having a wide demographic, including members who are physically and mentally handicapped and those from the LGBTQ community. Spotlight Productions provides a safe environment for young people of any ability, to meet on a weekly basis and learn new skills. A substantial number of our members have struggled to fit in or be accepted by their peers. We currently have young people in the group diagnosed with autism, asperges, dwarfism, physically handicapped and anorexia. Additionally, a number of our cast have experienced severe bullying at school, causing anxiety. they feel they belong and are accepted by all. The	
feedback that they receive from show	
performances is outstanding and demonstrates to	
the community what can be achieved by young	
people. For last 10 years we have been sponsored	
by Urban & Civic, who have provided us with an	
aircraft hangar (10,000 sq. feet) to store our	
35,000+ costumes and scenery, which we then	
hire out to other theatre groups and schools	
across the country. This allows us to raise the	
required funds we need for the group to put on	
our own shows, making us self-sufficient.	
Unfortunately, due to expansion of housing on	
Alconbury Weald we were advised earlier in the	
year, that we needed to vacate our current hangar	
by the end of 2022 as it is to be demolished and	
we would need to find Spotlight a new home. We	
have now secured alternative buildings at RAF	
Upwood and hope to move our scenery and	
costumes at the end of November, but	
unfortunately this has come at a considerable cost	
to the group. As well as the annual rental of	
£20,000 we will also need to reequip the new	
building with additional lighting and warehouse	
steps which we do not currently have. The lighting	
will cost £420.00 and two sets of industrial steps	
 will cost £650.00.
