Cambridgeshire Libraries (Warm Hub)	£400	£400	We wish to apply for a total of £400. This is broken down as £50 for each of the 8 libraries in Huntingdonshire: Huntingdon, Yaxley, Sawtry, St Ives, Ramsey, Warboys, St Neots and Buckden libraries. The funds would be used to provide a start-up supply of refreshments for each library (£25) to enable staff and volunteers to provide hot drinks to residents using the library as a Warm Space. The remaining £25 per location will be used to purchase a board game such as Scrabble, Rummikub / Family board game to encourage individuals and families to use the library space socially. The funding will be used to enhance the Warm Space offer in each of the libraries in Huntingdonshire. The Warm Spaces are already in existence but there is currently no funding to provide hot drinks to residents who may wish to stay a while. The addition of a family board game in each library will also encourage family groups to use the space. 			 caretaker will work additional hours to stack & lay out chairs and probably more cleaning will be required. We estimate this cost as £100 over the 5 months of the Warm Spaces scheme. The warm space is for people of all ages from all areas at all opening times and is based in Little Paxton. 			
Berkley Street Methodist Church, St Neots (Warm Hub)	£500	£1,500 - 1,600	 £500 is requested for providing a Warm Space for the benefit of Eynesbury and St Neots residents. We are aiming to be open all day each Thursday to provide a place where people can meet, or sit quietly on their own, in a warm and welcoming environment. The availability of a warm space will help people who feel lonely or isolated to come together and will help those who are struggling with the cost-of-living crisis. To respond to the needs of our community, we need to provide heating and lighting for our premises and cover the cost of cleaning. However, we are also looking to buy new furniture costing around £1,200 to make the seating area more comfortable and provide newspapers, books, games and hot drinks for those who use our warm space. How much we can offer depends on the funds available, but cleaning costs at least £250 per month, £20 a week on a selection of weekly newspapers and magazines would cost £240 over a 12-week period, plus the cost of tea, coffee, 	 Good Start Good Place Good Health 	Yes	Treasurer Eynesbury and St Neots

We request £250 towards the cost of gas because
this room is not usually heated. The staff are
volunteering their time. Any extra equipment -
jigsaw puzzles, board games, cards, etc has been
donated. The Parish Council are providing food
and drinks. CCC pay for the electricity for this
room under a long lease and have agreed to the
use as a warm hub. We also provide FREE use of a
pool table, football table and air hockey table. The
funding will be used for central heating the
Community Room when in use from 9:30 to 2:30
for one, or possibly up to 4, mornings per week
when other warm spaces in Somersham are
closed. We may also need to increase our cleaning
hours. Simple food/snacks and hot drinks are
being donated by the Parish Council. Games,
magazines, puzzles, etc, have been donated. A
volunteer is manning the hub. That room is only
heated when in use. Lighting is paid for by the
County Council which has a lease on this room
and our county councillor has agreed to it being
used for this project.
Somersham Parish Council is co-ordinating warm
spaces in the village. I think there are six in total.
We are the only one open in the mornings so far
and at present we are the only one providing free
food; - toast, pot noodles or pasta pots provided
by the parish council.
