What to do if vou see someone fly-tipping?

Take note of the llowing and report it to us via our webform:

1.Date, time and place of the incident

2. What the waste looks like and how much there is

3. Descriptions of any person and/or vehicles involved along with the registration number

AS FLY-TIPPERS ARE DOING SOMETHING ILLEGAL. THEY DO NOT WANT TO BE CAUGHT, DO NOT APPROACH THEM OR PUT YOUR OWN SAFETY AT RISK.

# How you can help stop fly tipping

Check the company has a 'waste carriers' licence with the Environment Agency by phone or online. Get a quote
(it costs £120 per ton to
get rid of waste legally)
so is it too good to be
true?

If you choose a company, they should show you their Waste Carrier License on arrival, if not do not use them. Find out where the waste is going for disposal before they load their van or trailer

- Note it down

Take a picture of your waste and the vehicle that is going to take it away - Save it just in case!

Once loaded the Carrier must give you a receipt which describes the waste they have taken and cost charged

If you communicate via Facebook, Messenger or Text, screen shot and save your messages.

If you see a fly tip, report it to us on our website or through our call centre for us to investigate



Huntingdonshire District Council has completed its first audit of a local business that has signed up for our Sustainable Communities Pledge Pilot.

Stukeley Meadows-based APPS UK Ltd, who provide high quality air pollution products and systems using environmentally friendly technology, signed up to complete the Bronze Level Award and are the first business to qualify.

Executive Councillor for Operations and Environment Marge Beuttell said: "Across Huntingdonshire, we have many thriving industrial areas which regularly struggle to get the recognition they deserve, from large chains to smaller independent businesses. The Sustainable Communities Pledge has been created with all sizes of business in mind, to be able to demonstrate and celebrate the great work that often goes into making the local community more sustainable through reducing litter, educating staff and improving the surrounding areas. The overall aim is to create a cleaner, safer and more welcoming area for the public and to encourage them to visit some of the unique businesses which we have throughout the district.
