

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when
 - a. there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
- 3. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 4. In paragraph 3, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to —

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- i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner:
- e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The premises licence holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 7. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 8. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a. a holographic mark, or
 - b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 9. The responsible person must ensure that
 - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - b. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

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- 10. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 11. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 10
 - a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (D x V) where
 - i. P is the permitted price,
 - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - d. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - e. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - f. "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 12. Where the permitted price given by paragraph b. of paragraph 11 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 13. Paragraph 14 applies where the permitted price given by paragraph b. of paragraph 14 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- 14. The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 15. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made:
 - a. By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that board, or
 - b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) (74 (3) (b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

1. Staff will be fully trained and aware of their duties in relation to the licensable activities and licensing

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objectives.

- a. Records of staff training will be maintained and kept at the premises.
- b. Staff will be provided refresher training every 6 months.
- 2. Sufficient CCTV will be installed and maintained at the premises
 - a. CCTV will be available to view and make evidential copies on request by an Authorised Officer
 - b. CCTV to have coverage of the entrance and exits enabling frontal identification of every person entering the premises during and outside operating hours
 - c. CCTV will be 24 hours
 - d. Digital images must be kept for 31 days with date and time stamps
 - e. CCTV footage will be available for viewing by an Authorised Officer
- 3. A challenge 25 policy will be in place at the premises
 - a. All staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID
- 4. Customers will be reminded by the way of notices to leave quietly and have regard to local residents.
- 5. Sufficient fire procedures in place at the premises
- 6. An accident book will be kept and update at the premises to record any accident/ injury
 - This will be kept at the premises and available for inspection when requested by an Authorised Officer.
 - b. This will be kept for a period of 3 years.
- 7. Internal and external lighting fixed at the premises.
- 8. All waste will be properly presented and placed out no more than 30 minutes earlier to scheduled collection times
- 9. No deliveries to the premises shall be arranged betweenn20:00 and 08:00
- 10. When live music is played the doors will be shut and noise will be managed by the premises manager
- 11. A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises available for inspection from an Authorised Officer.
