1 PURPOSE

Justification for Release

The Council as the Local Housing Authority is under a statutory duty to monitor the condition of the local housing stock and has recently established baseline figures for fitness, disrepair, the decent homes standard, energy efficiency, stock characteristics, and occupation/socio-economic data through a survey carried out in accordance with ODPM guidance. It is essential to keep this information up to date to meet CPA and ODPM requirements, particularly in connection with vulnerable households in non-decent homes and to monitor progress against ODPM targets. This bid is necessary to meet these on-going requirements. The release of these funds will allow partnership negotiations to be entered into with neighbouring local authorities with a view to a joint-procurement; which should enable officers to achieve efficiencies in the data maintenance contract.

Justification for Release

For air pollution control purposes the Council regulates and receives income from fees and annual charges levied against the operators of prescribed industrial processes. These fees and charges are set centrally by DEFRA and recent increases have failed to meet the Council's projections, based on inflation, and this has resulted in an annual deficit of £7000. These pollution control functions are statutory requirements and this bid is essential to close the budgetary gap, which is beyond the control of Council Officers. As the fees and charges are set centrally there is no scope for local adjustment.

Justification for Release:

This bid is made in support of the Council's published strategy for the identification of potentially contaminated land. This strategy was developed as a statutory requirement of Part IIA of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Preliminary, desk-based inspections have so far identified 69 sites where more detailed inspections are required to determine if further action is required. These more detailed inspections will mainly entail further research, walkover surveys and site inspections by authorised council officers but some will also require the employment of specialist consultants to conduct more detailed, intrusive investigations and analysis of samples.

The Council has statutory duties to fulfil under the Contaminated Land regime and this bid will enable the work to commence. The New BVPI's 216a and 216b published for 2005/6 are contaminated land indicators. To undertake the tasks necessary to progress with these indicators this funding is essential.
