CCG/53/25-26 (FWZFPNCX) CARESCO CARESCO Centre Guttering and Corridor heater	<p>The CARESCO Centre hosts the Green End Day Club, Chatterbox Carers Group, Sounds Good Music Group, Coffee Shop and Community Strength and Balance Classes. volunteers and visitors to the Centre average 200+ per month. The Centre is also used for Management and Trustee meetings and Quiz nights for the community.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improving the quality of life and well-being for Everyone Lower carbon emissions 	<p>Replace the faulty 25 years old corridor heater. Replacing it with a modern energy efficient heater will improve heat output, lower the charities significant heating costs and benefit our service users and the environment. The guttering at the back of the CARESCO Centre is very old, cracked and broken contributing to water pooling at the base of the building. We have installed a water butt but are not getting the maximum amount saved that we could. The garden at the back of the Centre is used by all groups, staff and volunteers in the warmer months. This will increase the life of the guttering significantly, prevent water loss, prevent damage to the building and ensure it is safe when the garden is used again in Spring 2026.</p>	£560.00

Badminton provides a positive outlet for physical health, mental wellbeing, confidence building, and social interaction. Offering free equipment and subsidised access ensures financial hardship does not prevent participation, supporting those at risk of inactivity, loneliness, or declining wellbeing.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improving the quality of life and well-being for Everyone • Keeping people out of crisis • Helping people in crisis 	A weekly community badminton programme at HBK Leisure for juniors and adult beginners, providing inclusive, low-barrier physical activity to improve wellbeing, build social connections, and support low-income and minority communities. The project includes equipment provision, beginner coaching, volunteer training, and community outreach to increase participation across Huntingdonshire. There is no comparable community badminton programme for juniors and adult beginners in the Huntingdon area. Local clubs are predominantly competitive and not beginner-focused.	£3,000
CCG/55/25-26 (NLHVDHFT) All Saints' Church, Morborne- from fragile to Forever All Saints' Morborne, from fragile to forever	The project would primarily tackle the theme of 'Improving the quality of life and well-being for everyone' by securing the future of All Saints' Church for the congregation, local people and visitors to Morborne and the surrounding countryside. Churches and the church community also have an important role in helping people in crisis, and keeping people out of crisis. We have received messages of support from many of the villagers. Morborne is a popular place for recreation- e.g. walking, birdwatching and cycling. CCG/58/25-26 (RCNZDGXP)	This project delivers a clear and tangible improvement to local quality of life by addressing a recognised gap in emergency health infrastructure in the Cromwell Abbey area. The development and its neighbouring estates currently have no publicly accessible defibrillator within a realistic response distance, despite serving around 100 households and bordering rural footpaths and adjacent developments. The nearest existing publicly accessible defibrillator requires a walk of approximately ten minutes each way, meaning a round trip of around 20 minutes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improving the quality of life and well-being for everyone • Keeping people out of crisis • Helping people in crisis 	This project will install a publicly accessible defibrillator in a central, highly visible communal location serving the Cromwell Abbey development in Ramsey and the surrounding residential areas. The project includes a solar and wind powered, heated outdoor cabinet (using a low-noise, discreet turbine), a fully automatic defibrillator (AED) and an emergency bleed control kit stored alongside the device. This will provide 24/7 access and help ensure the equipment remains operational year-round, including in winter when reduced daylight and overcast conditions can limit solar generation, with wind generation providing additional resilience without reliance on mains electricity.	£3,000

CCG/60/25-26 (TXVRTDNR)	Our community group launched in September 2025 with a series of concerts on St Neots Market Square to coincide with the Farm & Craft Market. These are funded by St Neots Town Council and delivered using some basic equipment provided by the Town Council, plus other borrowed equipment. Having our own, better quality PA equipment will improve the quality of these events and allow us to host larger musical ensembles. It will also allow us to deliver other events outside of the existing Town Council contract without needing to hire equipment on a per-event basis. This will significantly increase our ability to put on high quality events that are free (in public spaces such as the Market Square) or at affordable ticket prices (in local venues that we hire).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improving the quality of life and well-being for everyone 	The purchase of PA equipment is presented here as a stand-alone application.
