Further to your application, I have received a valid representation from a member of the public.

When we receive a valid representation, the first step is to attempt mediation in order to find a suitable solution that both parties are satisfied with and can agree on. Please see below the relevant part of the representation for your information:

My concern is that allowing a takeaway to operate until 02:00 may attract customers into the estate late at night, including individuals who may have consumed alcohol earlier in the evening and are seeking food after leaving pubs or other venues in the town.

This may lead to intoxicated individuals entering the estate during late-night hours when it is otherwise quiet. As someone who regularly passes through the area late at night, this raises concerns regarding potential disorderly behaviour, noise, and disturbance in an area that is not designed for late-night public activity.

Industrial estates also contain parked business vehicles and commercial premises which are closed overnight. Increased public activity during late hours may increase the risk of disturbance or nuisance affecting nearby businesses and property.

I believe the concerns raised may be alleviated with the inclusion of an additional condition which limits the public access to your premises after 23:00, therefore I propose the following condition:

The premises will operate a delivery service only from 23:00 to 02:00. Customers will not be permitted to collect orders directly from the premises during this time.

You are not required to accept the condition I have proposed. As the applicant, you may suggest an alternative wording, or you may choose not to offer a condition at all.

If we are unable to resolve the concerns raised in the representation through discussion, the application will be referred to a Licensing Sub-Committee. The committee will then consider all the information and make a decision on the application.

Please let me know how you wish to proceed.
